2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION SUMMARY

KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN – CAUTION. Causes moderate eye irritation. Harmful if swallowed, absorbed through skin or inhaled. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Remove contaminated clothing before reuse. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using tobacco.

This product is a brown liquid with slight ammonia odor. Primary routes of entry are inhalation, ingestion and skin contact.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

If in eyes: Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 – 20 minutes. Remove contacted lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye.

If swallowed: Call a Poison Control Center immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a Poison Control Center or doctor. Do not give anything to an unconscious person.

If inhaled: Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably by mouth-to-mouth, if possible.

If on skin or clothing: Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 – 20 minutes.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Dry chemical, carbon dioxide (CO₂), foam, water spray or fog.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
